Independent System Operators (ISOs)






- AESO is one of nine

Comparing Jurisdictions






Alberta Power Overview




Net-to-Grid Generation

Power Use in Alberta





AESO mandate



- Responsible for safe, reliable, economic planning and operation of Alberta Interconnected Electric System (AIES)
- AESO is a not-for-profit, statutory corporation; independent of government and industry:
 - Governed by independent board appointed by Minister of Affordability and Utilities
 - Must operate in the public interest
 - No financial interest in any generation unit, transmission or distribution infrastructure
 - No government funding; costs recovered from Alberta ratepayers
- Highest visibility of Alberta electricity sector





Alberta Coordinated Resilience Exercise (ACRE)



- Goal: Exercise the resilience of the Alberta electricity system in the face of a coordinated attack
 - Reliability is about keeping the lights on
 - Resilience is about planning for, operating through and recovering from a major electric system disruption
- Staggered Annual Exercise
 - NERC GridEx
 - ACRE



Objectives and Participants



ACRE 2022 objectives are to:

Activate and test incident,
 operating, and crisis
 management response plans

 Enhance coordination with government and law enforcement agencies

 Identify interdependency concerns with natural gas and telecommunications sectors



Strategic Outcomes (Review)

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- Tested communication and coordination with external parties to ensure reliable grid operations under adverse conditions
 - Scenario 1: Cyber Incident
 - Significant loss of visibility of Alberta Interconnected Electric System (AIES)
 - > Scenario 2: Physical Incident
 - Further disruption to the AIES while already under adverse circumstances


Outcomes:
